St. Agnes Parish plans to provide an individual home for a mother expecting. This pilot project, called the Visitation Maternity Project, is a different concept than the group home. One family cares for the pregnant mother for the period of pregnancy. The guest mother knows ahead of time where she will go after the child is born.

Although there is only one host home in the chosen parish it is hoped many families in that parish will simultaneously take part. One of the families

may provide maternity clothes. Another may offer financial assistance. A third may serve as a substitute home when the host family goes on vacation. Another family may simply pray for the successful completion of the pregnancy. The hope is to have as many separate parish families involved as possible.

Father DiAscanis, the pastor at St. Agnes, plans to change the parish pro-life committee from its current status to a ministry in its own right.

Bishop Dennis Madden initiated this program after a lay parishioner sought him out to discuss the concept. Bishop Madden hopes this idea will spread to many other parishes in time. Interested parties should contact Michele Melka at 410-362-7311.
